Due to the Covid-19 pandemic and subsequent requirement for social distancing, the last NC Code Officials Qualification Board meeting held in person at the NC Department of Insurance Building was conducted January 28, 2020. On March 16, 2020, an "Emergency" Board meeting was conducted via teleconference. On April 3, 2020, an "Emergency" Board was conducted via teleconference. The regular scheduled meeting conducted on April 28, 2020, was held via teleconference as was a "Special" Board meeting conducted on May 19, 2020. The regular scheduled Board meeting on July 28, 2020, was also conducted via teleconference. This report reflects a summary of business conducted of the aforementioned meetings.

### **March 16, 2020 meeting:**

Due to travel restrictions of jurisdictions CE requirements extended. Twelve (12) hours of CE must be obtained by June 30, 2021. Renewal fees still required by June 30, 2020.

### **April 3, 2020 meeting:**

PSI testing centers closed on March 19, 2020.

Temporary Certificates to be issued to any probationary certificate holder who has or had an active probationary certificate as of March 12, 2020 through December 31, 2020. The temporary certificate would be issued without application, to the individuals for the same level and trade. It will expire as of March 12, 2021. If the code official does not want the certificate, it can be returned within thirty (30) days of issue. A temporary certificate is not extendable or renewable.

### **April 28, 2020 meeting:**

Jonathan Morgan, CEO from the Town of Morrisville Inspection Department received his fifth level III certificate. Mr. Morgan received his Standard Electrical III on February 18, 2020.

### April 28, 2020 meeting (continued):

PSI testing center in Winston-Salem re-opened on April 13, 2020 to provide testing for essential services which includes code enforcement and inspections. The rest of the PSI testing centers are scheduled to re-open on May 1, 2020, but this may need to change to adjust to any governmental order or policy for public safety.

Community Colleges still closed. No standard courses have occurred since March 14, 2020.

Work on Residential Changeout Inspector program continues. Work is on-going for development of a course and certification test.

Teri Tart has been training an additional NCDOT Staff member to assist in the processing of standard and probationary applications.

Due to the uncertainty of this time and the extra challenges presented by Covid-19, Kathy Williams announced postponement of her retirement.

86 Probationary Certificates expired this quarter without the CEO completing all requirements for a Standard Certificate. Fire I, II, and III: 30.

Standard Online Instructor Course was completed with two (2) new Instructors; Mr. Josh Queen (Fire) and Mr. Matthew Sullivan (Law and Administration).

Currently 4,836 standard certificates out of 6,455 have met CE requirements for 2020 (74.9%).

### **May 19, 2020 meeting**

Residential Changeout Inspector (RCI) course development. The RCI committee decided to use a 4-hour online component which is required to complete before attending the 4-day classroom portion of the course.

Rich Hall is working with Subject Matter Experts (SMEs) to perform end-of-course and state exam psychometrics and this form would be used for those participating in the project. Kathy Williams stated that the Chairman or a representative for the Board needed to sign the form.

The Staff Director of the NC Code Officials Qualification Board to sign the Non-Disclosure and Confidentiality Agreement as the Board representative.

### **July 28, 2020 meeting**

NCDOT Staff is now working on individual schedules remotely and in the office. During May and part of June, staff worked two days in the office and three days remotely at home. On June 15, 2020, the Albemarle building reopened to the public and the entire staff returned to the office on a full-time basis. On July 10, 2020, the Commissioner of Insurance allowed employees to assess their specific needs and comfort level and select their working schedule. Committee meetings, public hearings and board meetings are being held by teleconference.

Some community colleges are offering classroom courses. A few standard courses have been held since the coronavirus pandemic began. Course registrations are minimized to maintain social distancing.

Temporary Certificates were issued On April 20, 2020 for the same level and trade as the Probationary Certificate with the applicable expiration date. The Temporary Certificate is not extendable or renewable. Staff worked with the NCDOT IT staff to handle the specialized programming needed to make these changes happen.

Work on the Residential Changeout Inspector program continues. Beth Williams is running point on this committee and has completed a large amount of work. Rich Hall is working with subject matter experts to develop the standard course

and state exam questions. The course will be a hybrid which includes online and classroom sections. The course will cover mechanical, plumbing and electrical aspects of the change out of like-for-like appliances.

With the execution of the emergency rule regarding expiring probationary certificates, temporary rule making began as well. The public hearing for the temporary was held May 6 and the rules were approved and effective July 1, 2020.

The second-year extension has been exercised with PSI. The extension of the contract allows for development of the new Residential Changeout Inspector certification and testing which will become a part of a new RFP in the future. Kathy Williams reviewed the components of the RFP with a working group in DOI for future submittal and posting. A draft should be ready for the October board meeting.

The entire NCDOI website has been reconstructed and has a new look. Each division has been redesigned and OSFM is currently under reconstruction. Terri Tart is participating in this effort.

NCDOI Staff worked with Charlie Johnson, NCDOI Fire code consultant, to prepare a survey regarding firefighters who seek fire inspector certifications for promotional purposes. The survey was sent to all paid and volunteer municipal departments. Over 1,200 emails were sent across the state and approximately 170 responses were received. Even though the response rate was low, it was evident that most municipal fire departments do not perform fire inspections even if they use the fire inspection program as a promotional tool. Some respondents did ask for some type of general fire/building code awareness training for their firefighters.

Terri Tart continues to train an additional NCDOI staff member to assist in the processing of standard and probationary applications. Kathy Williams has worked with Sam Whittington regarding the preparation for board meetings, agendas, and staff reports.

Effective April 20, 2020. 362 Temporary Certificates were issued to a code official who had or has a probationary certificate with an expiration date between March 12, 2020 through December 31, 2020. This Temporary certificate expires on March 12, 2021 for the same trade and level as the probationary certificate with an applicable expiration date. This certificate is not renewable or extendable. No application was needed for this action.

Some code officials will have an active Probationary certificate and an active Temporary certificate than run for most of this time period. The purpose of this certificate is to allow code officials time to take required courses and exams that are not available at this time due to COVID-19.

6,096 standard and limited certificates were renewed between 5/1/2020 and 6/30/2020. Also received were 298 late renewals for a total renewal of 6,394. CE was not a requirement for renewal this year due to the Board action. However, 12 hours of CE per certificate will be required by June 30, 2021 for renewal purposes.

Standard Online Instructor Course was completed with five new instructors. Christopher Whaley (Building), Christopher Wilcox (Fire), Daniel Pope (Building & Electrical), Daniel McKenzie (Fire), and Andrew Tallmer (Law and Admin).

Davidson County Community College held a Law and Admin course that was offered both online and face-to-face (simultaneously). Elizabeth Kilby, (Education Coordinator) for DCCC, helped to facilitate the course using Zoom for those students who chose to attend the course virtually. The rest of the students attended the course at Davidson County Community College with the instructor and Kilby. Social distancing guidelines were in place. Kilby stated that overall the course was a huge success, despite a few minor setbacks with getting the course up and running. The students appreciated having the options to attend the course. The success/pass rate was high. All students, except for one (seated in the face-to-face course) passed the End-of-Course (EOC) test. The EOC test was administered via Moodle and proctored by Kilby and the instructor both via online and in the classroom. Course evaluations can be provided upon request.

Currently Curt Miller (Education Coordinator) and Stacey Miller (Instructor) for Wilkes Community College are currently collaborating to develop an Electrical Standard Certificate Level I course. As they move forward, they would like to develop more. Curt mentioned they would like to use MS Teams to teach the course synchronously in addition to using Moodle/Respondus to administer the EOC exam.

- February 27<sup>th</sup> a House Committee was formed called the House Select Committee on Residential Planning and Permitting. Chair Rep. Brody, Vice Chair Rep. Potts, Members Rep. Dahle, Rep. Hanig, Rep. Hardister, Rep. Hunter, Rep. Jarvis, Rep. Richardson, Rep. Riddell and Rep. Willingham. The committee was derived from Moore County development and applicability of NC Fire code Chapter 5, Appendix B, Appendix C, Appendix D and how fire code applies to occupancy classifications. Conversations were centered on how to standardize requirements statewide. Introduction of Covid changed the focus of the legislature and this committee didn't meet again. - Most of this short session was covid related bills. We did see the fireworks bill didn't gain any traction. The governor vetoed HB686 which was the freedom to celebrate the fourth of July. We saw an enormous increase of illegal consumer use fireworks across the state on this date. I am confident that due to the restrictions placed on residents of this state and the inability to participate in sanctioned events. Due to this increase I'm confident the fireworks bill will be reintroduced in the long session 2021. When this does, we better prepare ourselves for it
